1. Read Genesis 1:26-31

 - i. Genesis 2:7 And the LORD God formed man of the **dust** of the ground, and **breathed** into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a **living** soul.
- b. Adam was blessed and given authority.
 - i. Gen 1:28 And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have **dominion** over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.
- c. Adam was the highlight of God's creation
 - i. Created in the image of God (Genesis 1:31)
 1. Gen 1:27 So God created man in his **own** image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.
 2. What does this mean?
 - a. Man was created to represent God both physically & spiritually.
 - b. Man, unlike the animal, has a spirit and can commune with God.
 - ii. Adam was highly intelligent
 1. Genesis 2:19-20 And out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto Adam **to see what he** would call them: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that was the name thereof. (20) And Adam gave **names** to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him.
- d. God gave Adam a job and a commandment with a consequence
 - i. Genesis 2:15-17 And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it. (16) And the LORD God **commanded** the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: (17) But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely **die**.
- e. Adam introduced death, but Christ introduced life.
 - i. Romans 5:14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the **figure** of him that was to come.
 - ii. 1 Corinthians 15:45 And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam was made a quickening spirit.
 1. "living soul" implies a mortal being with vitality (i.e. life)
 2. "quickeningspirit" implies an eternal being with immortality
