

## Isaac

*Hebrews 11:20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come.*

### 1. Isaac

- a. The promised son to Abraham & Sarah, named by God, meaning laughter
  - i. Genesis 17:19 And God said, Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his **name** Isaac: and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his seed after him.
- b. Isaac was a submissive Son
  - i. Genesis 22:6-9 And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering, and laid it **upon** Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife; and they went both of them together. (7) And Isaac **spake** unto Abraham his father, and said, My father: and he said, Here am I, my son. And he said, Behold the fire and the wood: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering? (8) And Abraham said, My son, God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering: so they went both of them together. (9) And they came to the place which God had told him of; and Abraham built an altar there, and laid the wood in order, and **bound** Isaac his son, and laid him on the altar upon the wood.
- c. Isaac married Rebekah which guided by God, Abraham, and Abraham's eldest servant (Genesis 24)
- d. Isaac prayed for his barren wife and Rebekah prayed for her struggling sons (Gen 25:20-26)  
Gen 25:20-23 And Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah to wife, the daughter of Bethuel the Syrian of Padanaram, the sister to Laban the Syrian. (21) And Isaac **intreated** the LORD for his wife, because she was barren: and the LORD was intreated of him, and Rebekah his wife conceived. (22) And the children struggled together within her; and she said, If it be so, why am I thus? And she went to **enquire** of the LORD. (23) And the LORD said unto her, Two nations are in thy womb, and two manner of people shall be separated from thy bowels; and the one people shall be stronger than the other people; and the elder shall serve the younger.
- e. Like his father, Isaac leaves home and lies about his wife
  - i. Gen 26:1-2 And there was a **famine** in the land, beside the first famine that was in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went unto Abimelech king of the Philistines unto Gerar. (2) And the LORD appeared unto him, and said, Go not down into Egypt; dwell in the land which I shall tell thee of:
  - ii. Gen 26:6-9 And Isaac dwelt in Gerar: (7) And the men of the place asked him of his **wife**; and he said, She is my sister: for he feared to say, She is my wife; lest, said he, the men of the place should kill me for Rebekah; because she was **fair** to look upon. (8) And it came to pass, when he had been there a long time, that Abimelech king of the Philistines looked out at a window, and saw, and, behold, Isaac was **sporting** with Rebekah his wife. (9) And Abimelech called Isaac, and said, Behold, of a surety she is thy wife: and how saidst thou, She is my sister? And Isaac said unto him, Because I said, Lest I die for her.
- f. Isaac blesses Jacob and Esau (Genesis 27)
- g. Isaac sends Jacob to Padanaram to find a wife (Genesis 28:5)
- h. Isaac dies at 180 years old after his two sons reconcile
