2. The Birth of Jesus

- a. Jesus was born of a virgin, Mary, an honorable woman. (Luke 1:34-38)
 - i. (34) Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know **not** a **man**? (35) And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.
 - ii. (37) For with God nothing shall be **impossible**. (38) And Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word. And the angel departed from her.
- b. More the 700 years earlier Isaiah recorded this prophesy
 - i. Isaiah 7:14 Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a **virgin** shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name **Immanuel**.
- c. Matthew quotes Isaiah, affirming the fulfillment of the virgin birth
 - i. Matthew 1:23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, **God with us**.
- d. Jesus was born in a stable in Bethlehem
 - i. Luke 2:4-7 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called **Bethlehem**; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) (5) To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. (6) And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. (7) And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a **manger**; because there was no room for them in the inn.
- e. Micah the prophet, a contemporary of Isaiah, recorded it would happen in Bethlehem.
 - i. Micah 5:2 But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from **everlasting**.
